The Kinderhut Foundation is an International NGO registered in Indonesia. Its primary interest lies in the long-term systematic care of disaster victims, including orphan children and destitute women. It does so by integrating them back into a secure family environment in dedicated premises, and providing for their requisite individual needs including quality education, vocational training and domestic support.

The foundation set up the first Kinderhut Village for orphan children and destitute women in Banda Aceh, Indonesia, one of the worst hit Tsunami areas in the world.

The institution today is home to 110 children and 10 women, fulfilling their every requisite need; from education and vocational training, through rehabilitation, to reintegration into family structures.

The Kinderhut Foundation is managed and supported by a team of leading professionals and entrepreneurs of diverse nationalities, based both in the United Arab Emirates and in the organization's respective project sites across Asia.

The organization is non-sectarian in character and works for the rehabilitation of children in the spirit of the U.N. Convention on the Rights of the Child. Kinderhut International has a branch office in Dubai, and is a member of the International Humanitarian City, the world's largest logistic center for humanitarian assistance activities.

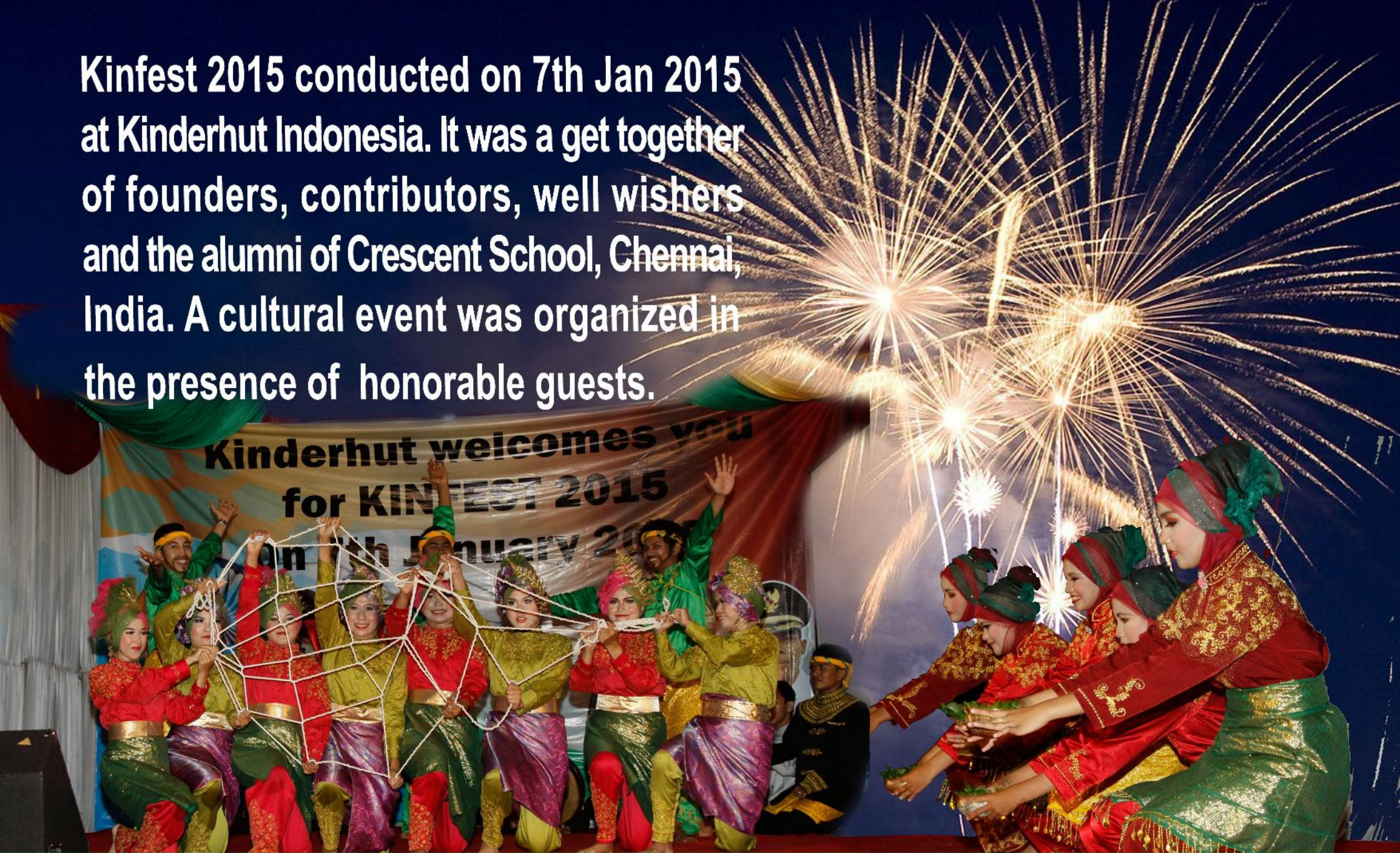

Aceh has received thousands of Rohingya refugees with open arms, providing them with food and shelter.

Kinderhut decided to help shed some light on this crisis and Kinderhut children initiated a project "Rohingyas Relief Project"

Kinderhut children Implemented this project in two phases.

I Phase

The Kinderhut Team reached in the relief camp, Kuala Langsa on 25th May 2015 and engaged in relief activities such as providing Food Supplies, Cleaning Temporary Camps, Conducting Educational Sessions, Helping Medical Team, Distributing Clothes, and helping refugees to avail other basic needs

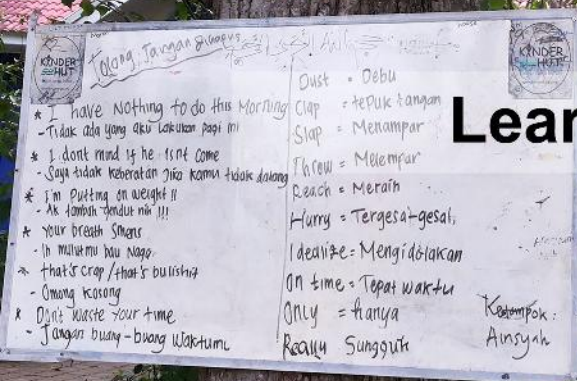

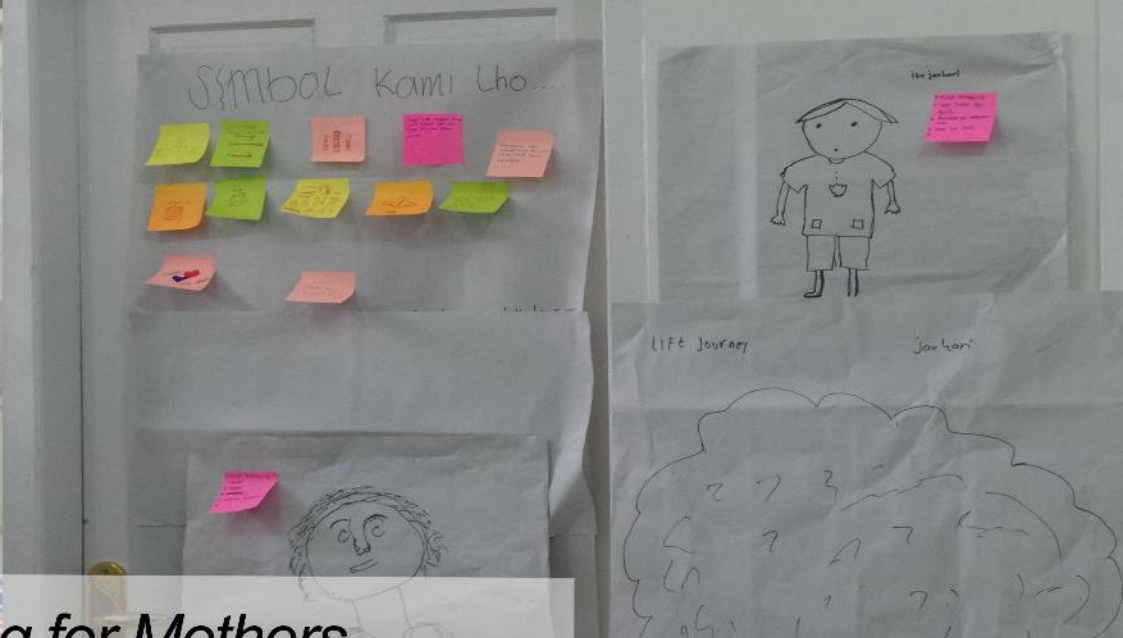
